**The French-American Heritage Foundation** is a 501(c)(3) charitable non-profit organization with the primary purpose of promoting and sponsoring French heritage events in Minnesota. Our Mission Statement:

#### To promote and preserve the French-American Heritage in Minnesota through education and community events.

French-language heritage has played an important role in the history of Minnesota. It is important and proper that this heritage be celebrated and remembered. The French-American Heritage Foundation:

- Maintains a website and a Facebook page focused on French-language heritages
- Sponsors educational events focused on French heritage
- Sponsors educational materials and books about French heritage
- Posts Minnesota French-American family history and genealogy to our website
- Provides scholarships for French language and culture studies

## **Membership Structure**

In addition to above events, the French-American Heritage Foundation planned to participate in the MGS Annual Genealogy Conference and the Family History Day at the Hennepin County Library. However, due to COVID 19, all the above events were cancelled, except for the Bastille Day Fête which occurred on a reduced scale in the parking lot near the Joly Family Center for International Understanding.

## **Planned 2021 Events**

At the present time, there are no planned events scheduled for 2021. Events planned for 2020 will be rescheduled once it is deemed safe to socially gather again.

The French-American Heritage Foundation is currently working on two heritage projects, namely the Little Rapids project and the Grand Portage project.

## Les Canadiens Errants

On October 1, 2020, Les Canadiens Errants, (The Wandering Canadians), a Minnesota nonprofit organization formed under Chapter 317A of the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act, dissolved and transferred all of its assets to the French-American Heritage Foundation. Les Canadiens Errants mission was to preserce and to conduct performances of French and French-Canadian folk music. It was originally formed under the name Les Joyeux Balladins in 1977, and reorganized under the name Les Canadiens Errants in 1983. Included with these assets are three CD recordings all sung in French: Voyageur music Volumes One and Two, and French Christmas Carols. These CD's will now be available for sale at all our future heritage events.

## **Little Rapids**

First, members of the Foundation have made several hiking excursions to the Louisville Swamp in Scott County to establish the location of the Jean-Baptiste Faribault Fur Trading Post located near the Dakota Village of Inyan Ceyaka. Otherwise known as Little Rapids, the Foundation intends to publish a story and film a YouTube video about this trading post and the Dakota village located nearby.

## **Grand Portage**

In August 2020, three members of the Foundation hiked the Grand Portage in Northern Minnesota and intend to produce a YouTube video about this excursion.

#### In Memory of Former Board Member Robert Hughes Perrizo Former French-American Heritage Foundation Board Member

Perrizo, Robert Hughes age 81, of Edina, passed away on Friday, March 13, 2020. Robert "Bob" grew up in Clontarf, Minnesota, graduated from Benson High School where he was an all-around athlete, later he graduated from the University of Minnesota's School of Journalism. Bob served one year in the United States Army before joining the Public Relations and Advertising Department at 3M. Later he launched his own advertising company, Promotional Mix, in Bloomington. He was a prolific sketch artist and renowned painter of portraits and scenes of historical times of the Midwest and was fascinated by and a descendant of the French voyageurs of the 1600's. Robert was a member of the French-American Heritage Foundation board of directors and graciously agreed to share his paintings with the Foundation's Heritage Book Projects. Copies of his paintings can be found in the books "They Spoke French" and "Where the Waters Meet."




## **French-American Heritage Foundation Projects**


### 1. They Spoke French

They Spoke French is a book on French heritage in Minnesota, including information on early explorers and settlers, early French Speaking settlements, including Metis, French Heritage Sites, French place names and other information about Minnesota's French Accent.




## 2. In the beginning, there was a CHAPEL

In the beginning, there was a CHAPEL, is the story of the small log chapel built by French-Canadians that became the nucleus of the city of St. Paul.




#### 3. Chez Nous

This set of three books contains 928 pages of Nouvelles Villes Jumelles and Chez Nous newsletters published during the years 1980 to 2001 by La Société Canadienne Française du Minnesota (LSCF). These three books are filled with numerous articles and stories about Minnesota's French-Canadian heritage and stories of French Heritage in North America.



#### 4. Where the Waters Meet


"Where the Waters Meet," is the story about how the state of Minnesota had its beginnings in the area known as "Mdote" by the Dakota (aka Bdote) which literally means "the place where the waters meet." The state's beginnings involved an interesting cast of characters including French explorers and fur traders with names such as: Pierre Le Sueur, Nicolas Perrot, Alexis Bailly, Jean Baptiste and Alexander Faribault, Joseph Rolette, and Joseph LaFramboise. This book is the story of that place, its role in our state's beginning, and a focus on the French-speaking people who were part of the transformation from Dakota Nation to a member of the United States. ### 5. Heritage Brochure

French-American Heritage Foundation completed the creation of a brochure showing French heritage sites in Minnesota. The heritage brochure project was designed to promote multidisciplinary on-site visitation and remote learning in a way that expands public awareness and understanding. The heritage brochure includes new, original illustrations and descriptions of 24 statewide sites and their significance to French heritage in Minnesota. All featured sites are publicly accessible.

During the early years of European settlement in Minnesota, many French-Canadians migrated here, and at least 79 French-speaking towns and communities were formed in Minnesota. French-speaking ancestors were important in all sectors of society, and they helped build our state and region into what it is today. This brochure shows some of the heritage sites in Minnesota that are related to Minnesota's French accent. The paintings in the brochure were created by artist H. Jean McFarlane (née Collette), a board member of the Foundation. They will be available at Foundation heritage events.



Below is one of the pages of the heritage brochure. All the artwork is original and was created specifically for the heritage brochure project.

#### Rivers

Father Hennepin Bluff Park. This 5.5-acre park rests on a wooded bluff overlooking the Mississippi River and St. Anthony Falls. It connects to many parks on both sides of the river through an extensive trail system. It is named for French-speaking Catholic Franciscan priest Fr. Louis Hennepin who visited the region in 1680 and kept a diary of his journeys and his discovery and naming of St. Anthony Falls. (9)





Red River Oxcart Trails. This network of 19th century oxcart routes connected the Red River Colony in Canada with the Mississippi River at Mendota and St. Paul. The trails provided French Canadians and the Métis people a way to transport furs and supplies without reliance on the monopolistic Hudson's Bay Company trade developed by and along the trails connecting Fort Garry with St. Paul. This commerce contributed to the settlement of Minnesota and North Dakota, and accelerated the settlement of Western Canada. (11)

Lake Pepin, Fort Perrot/Fort Beauharnois. The lake was first named in a 1703 map of New France made by Guillaume Delisle at the request of King Louis XIV. The lake was named for Jean Pepin who settled on its shores in the late 1600s after exploring the Great Lakes from Boucherville. Nicolas Perrot erected the first of several fur trade posts, Fort Saint Antoine, in 1686. In 1727 René Boucher de La Perrière and Michel Guignas built Fort Beauharnois on the lake. In the 19th century the lake was used to transport lumber downstream to mills at Winona and St. Louis. (12)





St. Anthony Falls. A major waterfall located in Minneapolis on the Upper Mississippi River, it was first named the Chutes de Saint Antoine in Father Louis Hennepin's 1680 journal and is part of the Mississippi National River and Recreation Area. It was a leading tourist attraction for French traders and early European settlers, and a special place for the Dakota people. This once significant source of water power sustained wool, cotton, and flour mills, as well as sawmill and paper mill trades. (10)


## **Donations**



## **100 Associates**

In recognition of the rich and long history of French presence in this state, a group of people interested in history, heritage and culture formed the French-American Heritage Foundation (FAHF) in 2013 with the purpose of promoting and sponsoring educational events, seminars and classes on French heritage in Minnesota. Most other ethnic groups in Minnesota have organizations that promote and preserve their heritage, and it is appropriate that Minnesota also has an organization that helps to preserve its French-Canadian and French heritage.



In the short time this Foundation has been in existence, it has become clear that the people of Minnesota appreciate the efforts and contributions that this Foundation has made to provide historical information and educational materials to the public. There will always be a need and desire to learn about our state's history. The French heritage in this state is part of our history, and should be remembered and be available to everyone. It is the intent of the FAHF to fulfill that need.



These efforts take time and money, and to ensure that this Foundation survives, it must have funds to ensure that its mission will be able to continue long into the future. For this reason, the FAHF is embarking on this fundraising campaign to raise \$100,000 to place into a perpetual endowment fund that will be managed by the St. Paul Foundation. The income from this endowment will then be used to help fund future educational events and services that meet the mission statement of the French-American Heritage Foundation.

At the present time the Foundation has received donations or pledges of \$20,000 from twenty-one persons, organizations or families. Once \$25,000 has been raised, the Foundation intends to open an account with the St. Paul Foundation and set up the fund so that annual distribution of the income generated from this fund will be distributed to the Foundation to fund future heritage events or projects.
